FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do the online programs work?

The online programs are accessible to students and teachers via the Mighty Minds Portal. The programs have been designed so students can easily navigate through the activities in each lesson. The program also includes several templates for students to make use of. Student responses are saved and submitted to the Portal, and teachers can then review and provide feedback on these answers. Teachers also have access to carefully crafted model responses for comparison. At the conclusion of the program, teachers are able to download a PDF which will contain a record of all student responses.

These programs can be integrated into your student's workday, homework schedule or used as additional resources to support your students' learning.

How long does it take to complete a Short Course?

QCAA developed the short courses with a notional implementation time of 55 hours. **This suggestion is not rigid**. Schools can choose to execute the course as they choose. It may be completed as a timetabled class, over a single semester or a year, before/during/after school or another variation. Schools may choose to deliver the content during school hours, and have students complete their assessment pieces outside of class. Mighty Minds' has ensured this flexibility is maintained in our online programs.

Is there a minimum number of students needed to purchase the online program?

The online programs do not have a minimum order quantity. The school purchases **individual licenses** for each program (one student per license). This allowance is given in good faith, and it is expected that schools will purchase the program for each student completing the course. If it is found that a school is not complying with this expectation, Mighty Minds will take all actions necessary to recoup lost profits. Why aren't all the Mighty Minds' Courses on the list of QCAA recognised studies?

Steps to the Future, and the Short Course in Literacy and Numeracy were designed as resources to supplement the teaching of the existing QCAA Short Courses (in Careers, Literacy and Numeracy). The materials provided by Mighty Minds are intended to guide students through the topics and assessment necessary to complete these courses. In essence, students will be completing the QCAA short course, using Mighty Minds materials as lesson content. Regardless, if these materials are delivered and administered correctly, participating students **will accrue a QCE credit**.

How do students obtain their QCE credits for Short Courses?

After students have completed all assessments, teachers are responsible for organising individual exit folios for participating students. The exit folio is comprised of the following:

- Evidence/transcripts from all assessment pieces (learning journals, extended responses, slides from presentations, examination answers, etc).
- Teacher judgements and annotated comments on assessment pieces.
- Assessment instruments used.
- A completed student profile (a template is included in resources provided by Mighty Minds), including an exit result.

Schools are responsible for submitting their exit results on the QCAA portal. **Schools are responsible for the compliance required to assign QCE credits to these programs**.

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
