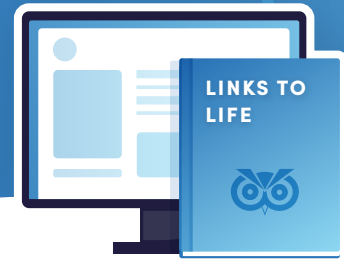


# Links to Life

Students can complete the lessons on their computers or tablets, and then email them to their teacher. Teachers will be asked to provide a grade from A–E to reflect the overall quality of the student’s lessons (48 per unit). The online exams (4 per unit) and final online assessment (1 per unit) will be marked by Mighty Minds. The final grade for each unit will be based on the grade awarded to the student’s lessons, all 4 online exams and the final online assessment.

Mighty Minds recommends allowing 55 hours per unit or 110 hours for both units.
